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The District has been notified that the Okeechobee County Health Department will no longer be providing the names of students who have tested positive for COVID-19 or conduct contact tracing. As a result, the District has had to alter how we address individuals with positive test results and/or symptoms of COVID-19. Effective immediately, the guidelines for **students and staff** will be as follows:

- In the event of <u>a positive test result and/or symptoms</u>, students and staff will remain at home for five days from the date of symptom onset. Once these days have passed, students and staff may return to school if they have been fever-free for 24 hours and their other symptoms are improving. It is our recommendation that masks will be worn for days 6-10.
- If a student or staff member wishes to return to work earlier than five days from symptom onset, he or she may do so if they have a note from a healthcare provider or have documented evidence of an existing condition that has symptoms similar to COVID-19 (e.g., seasonal allergies, etc.).
- We are now accepting rapid test results for both positive and negative tests.
- Student absences due to COVID-19 will be marked with a Q in Skyward and all work may be made up.
- Because we are no longer receiving information on the number of positive cases or exclusions from the Health Dashboard, the District's COVID-19 Dashboard will no longer be updated.

Please remember to send a doctor's note if possible to excuse the absence. <u>Students who accumulate</u> 15 <u>unexcused absences in a 90 day period will be reported to the DMV and have their driving privileges suspended</u>. In order to regain their driving privileges they must be in school for 30 consecutive days without any unexcused absences.

OHSFC will be accepting deliveries for students on Valentine's Day. Students will be allowed to pick up deliveries at the end of the day. Please remember that glass containers and balloons are not allowed on OCSD school buses. Also, if your student is at OHS at the end of the day their delivery will need to be sent there for pickup at the end of the day.
